There are two components to helping students thrive as independent readers—time to read and access to books they find appealing. First, students need quiet time to engage in reading and to practice being a reader. An increase in the time a student spends reading improves comprehension and builds vocabulary—two critical skills for success in all subject areas. Second, students need the autonomy to choose books of varying levels of complexity to stay engaged in the task of reading. Summer reading affords students these opportunities in order to extend the work that has been happening in the classroom throughout the year and to maintain the skills earned during reading and writing in the classroom.

Summer Reading Requirements:

Students will read two books over the summer as well as keep a record/journal of the title, author, number of pages, and genre (fantasy, science fiction, realistic fiction, historical fiction, nonfiction, etc.) of each book. This record/journal may be done on a Word document, Google document, or loose leaf paper. Bring your printed document on the first day of class. Students will be completing a book talk on one of their chosen books in class. Further instructions concerning the book talk will be given in class.
